#### Presidential Points

Strong athletic teams have focused my pride in Point Loma High School this year - 29-0 and a state championship is mighty impressive - but there are other things going on at PLHS too. Dr. Gauntlet's column will tell you about a number of these. One other point of interest is the progress of the PLHS Foundation, an organization that I've mentioned before. This organization, founded by parents and alumni, is a tax-exempt collector of funds to better Point Loma's college prep program. This year the Foundation has collected more than \$7,400 for PLHS and has disbursed (or soon will disburse) about \$5,700. Among the disbursements are the purchase of a video cassette recorder for the biology department and a special allotment to Mrs. Hill of the English department for the employment of a skilled reader to edit and criticize student writing. Further, the Foundation provided Dennis Donnelly, head Media librarian, with funds to begin purchasing volumes of literary criticism of works of current authors. These books, which are invaluable guides to interpretation, would not otherwise be available to the Media Center.

I am delighted with the success that the Foundation has attained. I hope that you share my pleasure and will consider the Foundation as a recipient for some of your charitable contributions.

Dear Alumni:

The Freshman Class is back on the Point Loma High School campus again. The 1983-84 school year brought some interesting challenges by the addition of 600 students, 30 staff members and 14 new bungalows. I am happy to report that the ninth graders appear to be effectively integrated into the life of our school.

The school year 1983-84 also marks the year that Coach Trepanier and our girl's basketball team brought the state championship to Point Loma High School. It is the only high school athletic team (boys or girls) from San Diego County to have won a C.I.F. state championship.

I am grateful to the Point Loma High School Alumni Association under the leadership this year of Mr. Howard Wiggins for its continued support of our school and students. The association is again providing \$1,000 this year for scholarship grants to deserving students.

It also has been wonderful to receive contributions from individual alumnus and from reunion classes to the Walkway to Freedom project. Through the initial efforts of Miss Melinda Roberts, a junior who suffers with rheumatoid arthritis, we are raising funds to build an elevated walkway that would connect the second floors of the 300 and 400 buildings. Hope Consultant group has contributed the architectural plans. We have raised about \$10,000 so far but will need four times that amount. We solicit your help in this worthy project. Contributions can be made out to Point Loma High School where we have set up a trust account for these funds. If any of you are building contractors and could contribute some part of the construction of the facility, we would appreciate hearing from you.
