After having seen what a wonderful transformation took place at the Dana Education Center, the idea was born to start a group dedicated to making Point Loma High school a premier campus by the year 2000. Focusing on the physical revitalization of the campus, Point Loma 2000's five-year plan is to promote student, staff and community pride and an atmosphere in which academic achievement will flourish. The committee is encouraging broad-based support from students, staff, parents, the community and Point Loma High School alumni to assure an ongoing commitment to the students and the school.

Other fine organizations at the school including: the PTSA, the Point Loma Foundation, and the Alumni Association are mainly dedicated to improving the academics of Point Loma. Presently, Point Loma 2000 is the only organization to zero in on the campus itself, in order to reverse many years of deferred maintenance caused by budget cuts, vandalism and just plain neglect.

> Point Loma 2000 Up and Running

Point Loma 2000 is dedicated to transforming Point Loma High School into one of the premier high schools in the San Diego Unified School District by the year 2000. The ambitious project intends to raise \$600,000 over the next five years. Mixed with volunteer efforts and support from the district, the project will complete over \$1,000,000 of improvement. As a key to Point Loma 2000's fund raising efforts, Point Loma 2000 will sponsor the first annual Point Loma Scenic Run on July 29,



1995. Over 1000 participants are anticipated. The event course will cover the most scenic venue in San Diego overlooking the city and bay on one side and the

Pacific Ocean on the other. The 10K event will be from Point Loma Nazarene College to the Cabrillo Lighthouse and return. There will also be a 5K walk from the Lighthouse to the College. Refreshments and entertainment will greet the participants on return to the campus. All participants and volunteers will receive commemorative T-shirts. Peninsula Bank is a title sponsor of the event. #### Point Loma 2000 (cont. p3) Mike McCartt Donates 31,600 Pennies


