
Message from the Principal:

When James Gauntlett, principal of PLHS in 1977 was interested in having an association to help graduates become involved in activities relating to the school, class reunions and the community, he called together a group that met for more than a year. These founders created the by-laws for governing the organization and developed ideas around what could be done for the alums, the school and the surrounding area. The PLHS Alumni Association resulted and was officially incorporated in 1978.

The first president was David Porter'39. The seven members of the original board of directors consisted of alums from the '30s through the 60's. Our original membership consisted of lifetime members and annual members who would receive newsletters twice a year giving them reunion information, news of the school and sports programs along with other interesting information.

As each class graduated from the school they were offered a discounted membership fee so a nucleus of that class would receive information about when their class would reunite. All class lists from 1926 to the present have been made available to chairpersons willing to organize their class reunions.

Several years ago the leaders of the P.L. Foundation, the Alumni Association, and Committee 2000 met to look into combining the three organizations into one powerful unit to enhance the activities each unit was doing separately. This has been done, and the school and community have seen great benefits from this merger. The mission statement of the Point Loma Foundation and Alumni Association points to our great commitment to the school and the community.



PLHS Football Booster Club Kicks Off with New Season

This season marks the inaugural year for the Point Loma High School Football Booster Club. The Booster

Club was organized and chartered by the PLHSFAA this past summer. The purpose of the Booster Club are to provide moral, physical, and financial support for football activities as well as to foster and maintain school spirit among the students, faculty, parents, and Peninsula community. The Boosters will encourage adult support and assistance in promoting the football program at PLHS.

We are currently looking to fill the positions of Secretary, VP of Publicity and PR, and Freshman Chair. Anyone interested in serving in these roles is encouraged to contact Ron Cunningham at 619-226-4063 or any other Board Member as soon as possible.

Principal Mike Price, Coach Mike Hastings, and Athletic Director John Gunther provide liaison with the Booster Club.

Through the efforts of the Booster Club and with the support of Principal Mike Price and Coach Hastings, PLHS is launching a campaign to install a new playing surface for the football and soccer teams as well as all other students using the stadium facilities. These types of playing surfaces have been installed at La Jolla High School, Mira Mesa High School, San Diego High School, Patrick Henry High School, and Grossmot Comunity College. We are working with SD City Schools to finance up to 60% of the cost of this project.

These new playing surfaces are attractive in several respects. Most importantly, they reduce the number of serious concussion, knee, leg, foot, and ankle injuries over the course of a season. In addition, these

fields are maintenance free, relative to current grass fields. Further, they enhance property values and the school by keeping students in the area to play sports.

This will be an ambitious project requiring considerable support. Already we we need to raise \$250,000 - \$300,000 by the end of April 2002 to fund our 40% share. The surface will be installed during the summer of 2002 and will be ready for play in the fall. To raise the necessary funds, we are considering a direct solicitation campaign. In the coming months, members of the Booster Club will be contacting past, present and future students and their families for support, as well as community leaders, and business owners. Anyone interested in assisting in this campaign is urged to contact the school, the Foundation, or the Booster Club.

This is a very simple overview of a complex process but your help in accomplishing this task for our students is most urgently needed. We are particularly interested in hearing from those of you who can provide subcontracting services in the construction process, i.e., hauling, grading, compacting, soil engineering, fill supply, etc.

Thank you for making this effort a success.



PLHS Votes for Youth and Government Program at YMCA

Last year the Point Loma Foundation provided financial support to PLHS students participating in the Annual Youth and Government Program through the Peninsula Family YMCA.

Now it its 51st year, the Youth and Government Program involves approximately 2,200 high school sophomores, juniors and seniors throughout the State of California from high school delegations from YMCAs throughout the State. This hands-on educational program about California government culminates in a model legislature and court conference at the State Capitol in Sacramento. There, delegates utilize the State Senate and Assembly chambers while the legislature is in recess, as well as California Supreme Court facilities.

Last year, approximately 20 Point Loma High

School students participated in this program with the Peninsula Family YMCA. Participants in the program obtained skills useful to any career, whether in or outside of government. As part of this program, students explored issues, debated and researched changes or

debated and researched changes or additions to California law, drafted legislation and championed legislation through a model legislative process, or advocated positions before model courts. The PLHS Foundation contrib-


PLHS COMMEMORATIVE NOTECARDS FOR \$ALE

This summer was a real treat seeing so many alumni and learning of their professional and personal accomplishments - and this is what teaching is really about!




