


formed before a 700-member audience in November to rave reviews. I hope you were part of it but if not, you

#### Message from the Principal:



PLHS Foundation and Alumni Association is proud to present the PLHSFAA Scholarship Endowment Fund. The ultimate goal of the Scholarship



#### **GIFTS AND GRANTS**

While the Point Loma High School Foundation and Alumni Association has been busy raising funds, the Gifts and Grants Committee has been receiving grant requests from various teachers and special groups at the high school. The G & G Committee takes these requests to the PLHSFAA Board to either fund or find another means of support.

Through generous donations and successful efforts such as the Mile of Dollars, Point Loma Unplugged, School and Community solicitation letters, the Membership Drive, and the upcoming Golf Tournament, we have been able to support a wide variety of dreams and needs at PLHS. These include new hurdles for the athletic department, percussion instruments for the marching band, materials for a Colorguard backdrop, an editing system for use in making films for all students and all departments, electric race cars to enable physics students to compete in the county "Electric Challenge", and a new copier for the office.

Also funded, is the Princeton Review program, which keeps the costs down for students wanting to increase their SAT scores with a month-long class, support for the Dance Team, who qualified for a National Competition, and the Sailing Team. The Board also pledged support for the community wide PLHS turf project, and gave tuition assistance to the Youth & Government program. Monies raised at the "Point Loma Unplugged" show will be used for improvements in the PAC, and the Board was able to give funds to the PLHS Scholarship Fund.

All funds raised through the PLHSFAA efforts have helped fulfill school dreams and meet worthy needs. On behalf of the PLHSFAA, thank you for your continued support. We all have good reason to be proud of Point Loma High School.

#### Landscaping and Site Improvements to Beautify PLHS

A new PLHSFAA sub-committee (Landscaping and Site Improvements) is exploring needed improvements to the appearance and safety to the front of Point Loma High School along Chatsworth Boulevard. Current proposals include:


- A newly-designed school entry, enhancing the entry's appearance and visibility to the community.
- Widening the sidewalk along Chatsworth Boulevard to comply with recommended safety standards and provide adequate access for students entering and exiting the school.

• Adding a small retaining wall along the school side of the widened sidewalk, usable as seating for students waiting for transportation, while also retaining the hillside along the school where new landscaping is envisioned.

The proposed sidewalk and retaining wall incorporates an area for students waiting for bus transportation that will have a high circular retaining wall along the hillside, displaying the school's initials.

The high school's current border along Chatsworth Boulevard has a narrow sidewalk and lacks needed clearance for pedestrians passing along this busy thoroughfare. Moreover, the school entry is nearly invisible to the community.

These proposals are preliminary and the sub-committee is seeking a landscape architect to help with the design and is exploring available financial resources from the school district, city and community to help create these improvements. #### **Point Loma High School Band News**

The Point Loma High School Band Spring Concert will be the evening of March 21, 2002 in the PAC. The band will play music they are preparing for two upcoming High School Band and Orchestra Festivals at Grossmont High School (March 16) and Clairemont High School (April 13).

The Band students and Band
Booster parents have been actively
raising money to support and enhance
our growing music program. Almost
\$6,000 has been raised this year through a golf
tournament, fees and donations, concession
sales and candy sales. The majority of these
funds has been or will be spent on instrument
sectional coaches, transportation, competition
fees, and band awards.

Additionally, thanks to \$25,000 in funding from the City of San Diego—obtained through the efforts of Councilmember Byron Wear—the Point Loma High School band room now sports brand new lockers for musical instrument storage! These lockers provide secure (and attractive) storage for both school- and student-owned instru-

ments, as well as a location for the band's music library.

The Band has also been able to replace \$4,000 worth of worn out percussion equipment through a generous grant from the PLHSFAA, and to purchase an instrument strobe tuner, a synthesizer/keyboard/MIDI, and several new instruments through 75th Gala funds raised last year.

The last PLHS Band fundraiser of the year will be a giant rummage sale on April 27 from 8 a.m.-2 p.m. at Dusty Rhodes Park in Ocean Beach. If you have items you would like to donate, contact band parent Susie Leon at (619) 758-9526, and she can arrange for immediate pick up (and storage at our donated space courtesy of Storage USA on Sherman Street).



### Cheerleading Team Boosters Kick Up Support

"Go! Fight! Win! Go, Pointers!" The familiar cheers can be heard at sports events fall, winter and spring, led by enthusiastic Pointer cheerleaders boosting their team. This year, however, the cheerleaders have their own

boosters – the Cheer Team Boosters. As a competition squad, PLHS cheerleaders incur significant costs. The Cheer Team Booster group was established in November to raise funds to support the team. A rummage sale was held in November as our first event.

Cheerleading today involves more than rooting at games. Cheer teams prepare and perform complicated routines at local and national competitions. Requiring strength, coordination, precision and endurance, cheer is the "sport of choice" for the many young women who tryout each year. The dance, gymnastics and stunts of cheer require year-round coaching. Not recognized as a sport by CIF, the team must cover their own costs for uniforms, coaching, competition and travel fees. By raising funds to support the team, the Cheer Team Boosters group reduces the burden of the Cheer Advisor and the cost of participation for the cheerleaders.

Cheer Team Boosters is open to parents/guardians of cheerleaders, PLHS alumni, and interested community members. Our meetings will be held in conjunction with cheer parent meetings (contact Cheer Advisor Donna Gramm-Gonsalvas at PLHS for meeting info.) 
wife, Theresa Azeveda '50 and 5 of their children (PLHS grads) greeted the ship as it docked at its new home port.

#### NEWS FROM 1931 Pointer

#### Newsletter - Volume 1, No.1 November 6, 1931

- Enrollment increased by 122 students making a total of 892 which included junior high school.
- PLHS made a radical change in its period schedule. Lunch went from 40 minutes to 30 minutes, time between classes cut to 4 minutes from 5 minutes. The rescheduling was done to make more time for home room, assemblies, etcl.
- The cost per pupil of operating San Diego schools for the year 1930-31 was \$117.00.

Thanks to Molly Karlsgodt'66 for donating this Pointer back to the school. Her mother, Lois Stephens, was an assistant editor on the Pointer staff in 1931 going on to be editor her senior year.
