
Anyone driving by Point Loma High School these days will be sure to notice the new electronic marquee in front of the recently completed 100 building. This is the first of three signs planned for the school. Next to be installed is a small monument sign (pictured) at the opposite end of the campus. Situated on the hillside overlooking the intersection of Chatsworth and Voltaire, this sign will be the cornerstone of the Foundation and Alumni Association's "Landscape and Site Improvement Project." The landscape committee has been working for over two years on this complicated undertaking. Safety and student access issues have been exhaustively researched, an array of native and drought-tolerant plants has been selected, and numerous funding possibilities have been explored. As of late March 2004, the completed plans - prepared by Estrada Land Planning - will go to the school district for review.

Principal's Corner



Welcome to the final quarter of the 2003-04 school year at Point Loma High School. Budget woes and District troubles abound, but the high quality education for all of our students continues in the classrooms on a daily basis at Point Loma High School. The site itself is looking at a \$500,000 reduction in staffing and funding for the 2004-05 school year and the staff and I are currently exploring options for making sure that the level of service to our students remains high and consistent. I fear that much of our planning will not see fruition until long into the summer months when the true impacts of the reductions are felt at the site level.

The Foundation Board and committees have planned a wealth of activities and events for the spring and summer. You will find the details for all of these events in the next few pages. I would like to spend just a couple of minutes talking about involvement.

The Foundation and Alumni Association came into being as a result of the merger of the Point Loma Foundation, the Point Loma Alumni Association, and PL2000 with the firm belief that a coordinated effort and a single

umbrella organization would be the most beneficial to the school and the community. The mission of the Foundation and Alumni Association is to provide the support and funding to those events, activities, programs, and people that make Point Loma High School unique among San Diego City Schools. For six years the PLHSFAA has carried on that tradition with excellence.

A time of transition is on the horizon when the last of the original crafters of the merger and the current principal will have to pass the reins of leadership and involvement to a new generation of leaders. The truth of the matter is that the PLHSFAA runs on people and the skills, contacts, and work ethic of those members who serve on the governing board and work behind the scene on the myriad of committees. Without these special volunteers, the organization exists only on paper and cannot continue to provide the program uniqueness, which characterizes PLHS.

Thank you for your continued support.





The project, which addresses the entire Chatsworth frontage of the campus, is divided into several phases. The first to be implemented will be the area from the gym driveway to the southwest corner of the school's property. Currently this area is a tangle of overgrown shrubs, pickle weed and rusted chain-link fencing. Unfortunately, this is the first view of the school when approaching from Ocean Beach and most of Point Loma. The project will continue up the hill, widening the sidewalk in most areas, creating a new campus entrance (handicapped accessible), installing irrigation, and thoroughly re-working the landscaping. The culmination of the project will be at the school's main entry at the intersection of Chatsworth and Zola. Here, a large monument sign will be installed beneath the existing Torrey Pine trees (both signs were inspired by the original 1925 mission-style buildings that were demolished in the 1970's), the lawn area will be expanded, benches will be installed, and all hardscape will be drastically improved.

Point Loma High School is placed very prominently in the community - not just geographically, but at the top of the K-12 experience. Our young adults spend so much of their time there. They deserve a school that they can take pride in. This is the largest project in the history of the Foundation & Alumni Association. Community support is vital to its success. 
