Restoring Pointer Pride in the Campus



Message From PLHSFAA Co-Presidents



The proposed remodel of the front of the school addresses safety, access and appearance. The renovation will include...

A new, wider sidewalk which will ease the dropping off/picking up of students, reduce traffic congestion and improve visibility of students to drivers.

Seat walls and waiting areas for students to further enhance their safety

Replacement of unattractive plantings

(including weeds and iceplant near Voltaire/ Chatsworth corner) with lush yet lowwater-use trees, plants and flowers

- Pruning and cleanup of mature trees and bushes
- · Water-efficient irrigation
- Stone-like monument signs engraved with PLHS
- Improved access for all students, including those with limited physical abilities

Construction costs are going up, and today the total cost of the project is estimated at approximately \$400,000. The San Diego Unified School District approves of this project, as does the City of San Diego, which has provided \$40,0000 of redevelopment matching funds. Approximately \$15,000 of Prop. MM funds will be directed toward this effort, and alumni, parents and community groups have started to provide gifts.

Approval permits are being obtained from the school district and city, and now we need our families and community members to step up.

Point Loma High Film students had four films screened at the San Diego Museum of Photographic Arts in December as part of STUDENT FILM CONFIDENTIAL sponsored by the San Diego Film Critics Society. Caleb Paullus' stop-motion film, THE DROID CHRONICLES, is a hilarious science fiction spectacular about a base camp that has been overthrown by robots. Mitchell Wright's public service announcement, VOTING warns of the perils of not being an educated voter. Jesse Brunt (now attending Brooks Institute of Photography) and junior, Tyler Knell's film, RECYCLE is a clay animated film about a tin can with aspirations of being recycled in order to be used for bigger and better things like a roller coaster or a rocket to the moon. (Jesse and Tyler were commissioned by the City of San Diego to make this film after the success of their animated film, 24 HOURS TILL CHRIST-MAS which was screened at the Los Angeles International Short Film Festival, San Diego Film Festival, Imperial Beach Film Festival, and was the winner of a Regional Emmy Award and two Innovative Video in Education Awards). Josh Lizarraga's film, TWISTED NERVE is an animated film about an innocent cartoon child transformed into a psychotic killer and was inspired by Bernard Hermann's film scores.

What made the night at even greater honor was that Point Loma High School was the only high school with films in this collection. All other films were from universities and colleges. Students received praise for their films from directors, writers, and producers at the museum reception following the event.

> The Film classes also have a partnership in education with the Warner Brothers station, KSWB and filmed a section of the TV Maga zine, MY GENERATION. The section was on PL student, **Parker Shinn**, international model for Calvin Klein and National

Sailing Champion. The episode was written and filmed by juniors Tyler Knell, Ben Smedley, and Eric Louie. The host of the thirty minute show which was broadcast on KSWB was Point Loma senior Amanda Hess. Amanda and Christine Sutton were also selected to film a public service announcement for the San Diego Blood Bank which will air throughout the year.

Jacob Yufa, Josh Lizarraga, and Tyler Knell have started a new Point Loma series of documentaries tentatively called EXTRAORDINARY PEOPLE. They are currently developing a film about San Diego resident, Laura Simon, author and artist who has the distinction of being 99 years old. She just completed her 550 page book. Jacob, Josh, and Tyler have interviewed Ms. Simon as well as her colleagues and friends including author and columnist, Don Harrison, and UCSD literature professor, Charles Chamberlain. The completed film will be screened later this year at our Annual Student Film Festival which will also feature a wide variety of Point Loma student films.

Robert Arentz, director of the Los Angeles International Film Festival, says that Point Loma has one of the most outstanding film programs and students in the United States and has once again, asked me to send him our best films for inclusion in next year's festival at the ArcLight Cinema in Hollywood. This terrific program (currently, there are 110 students enrolled in the film classes) in visual and performing arts could not be possible without the incredibly talented and creative students of Point Loma High School. Everyone of them is a storyteller!






